APRIL 3RD MEETING AT CHESTER LIBRARY @ 7:00PM

GUEST SPEAKER - OFFICER ROGERS, will talk about Neighborhood Watch and answers questions from homeowners about safety.

Thank you for contacting me and letting me know about damaged street signs, street lights out, mailboxes need repair. The main street signs are going to be repaired with new rivets and brackets. The signs are about 15 years and the brackets are very worn out. Woodcraft signs has ordered the rivets and signs will be repaired within the next 2 weeks.

RSG Landscaping topped crepe myrtles, pompous grass and liriopie grass. Pruning of knock-out roses will be done after they see a little growth. Horticulture oil on bushes for lace bugs and other insects. Chris says the oil does not harm your bushes. They have been cleaning the mulch beds and trenching getting ready for new mulch in March. This takes time, I will email you and let you know when they start the mulching. Depending on weather the irrigation will be cut on end of March.

I have attached the Landscaping calendar for 2019. Please keep in mind the dates in the calendar is not set in stone, due to weather. We hope this will help this year for clarification on landscaping maintenance.

There is also information on drainage issues in yards, snow removal procedures and homeowners' responsibility.

Chris and Dawn will be walking your yards to identify drainage problems and we will be sending you the information and how to remedy the problem. Chris and I walked the community first of February and identified the shrubbery that needs to be replaced. I am walking again to make sure all dead shrubs are on my list. Depending on weather the dead bushes will be replaced in March too.

Spring is a great time to walk around your home and identify whether you need to paint your doors, shutters or railings. Check on your fences, gates and some homeowners have lattice around HVAC. They may need to be repaired, painted or stained. If you do not have a repair company, please give me a call I have several handymen or companies contact information.

*Please keep in mind our community abides by the Chesterfield County leash law. Which states dogs are to be on a leash or in a fence even if the dogs are in the homeowner's yard. We need all homeowners to abide by this law. Pick up after your dog while walking is a neighborly thing to do.
